Strategic Plan Objectives:

Academic Distinctiveness

- 1) Evaluate scope and sequence K-12 assuring we are using the best practices in Christian education by wholly investing in a biblical worldview and robust academics.
- 2) Ensure every child has the opportunity to achieve their full potential through proper guidance, assessment and follow-through.
- 3) Develop broader and deeper understanding of student abilities, both individually and summative by creating new, year-round, assessment tools.
- 4) Research and develop a strong relationship with benchmark schools, regularly collaborate on academic best practices.
- 5) Review course catalog and look for opportunities to add electives for all learners in upper grades.
- 6) Create a thorough professional development program for faculty by regularly reviewing classroom instruction and collaboration with teachers via grade level and subject.

Christian Formation

- 1) Establish new goals, based on current social challenges, regarding student formation. For example, what does the preferred CCS graduate look like from a spiritual perspective?
- 2) Reconsider how and what we teach students on grade levels, at chapels, in small groups to ensure they are receiving biblical instruction, on key issues, at the appropriate age.
- 3) Create more service learning opportunities (new initiatives) for students including local and global.
- 4) Engage with select parents to help foster student spiritual growth outside of the classroom.

Master Plan for Future Growth

- Ensure the campus is being wisely developed through thorough evaluation of existing land and opportunities for growth adjacent to the current campus and potentially off site with new campuses.
- 2) Develop a strategic financial plan to fund the growth of school while not taking on unnecessary debt.
- 3) Focus on getting bigger while still staying small, focus on small class sizes while increasing the amount of students per grade, targeting a specific student population for long term success defined by student engagement, parent partnership, opportunities for students.

Long Term Financial Stability

- 1) Develop a short and long term plan for increasing faculty and staff compensation that allows for continued teacher retention while also having the resources to attract top talent when positions open.
- 2) Take on minimal debt while growing school, pay down any current debt as soon as possible, while maintaining a healthy debt to income ratio to ensure financial stability.
- 3) Consider adding to the business and development office to allow for more focus on financial gain and stewardship.
